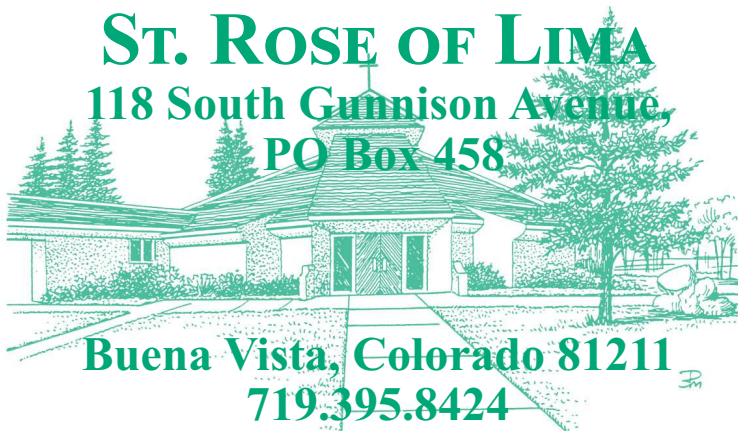

All liturgical ministers, please arrive 15 minutes before mass begins to meet in the sacristy for prayer.

I am writing this column 3 days before the presidential inauguration. I saw a story on an alternative news source on the internet which said that protesters are being hired for as much \$2,500 to disrupt the inauguration. It showed the ads that were being put on various left-leaning websites which solicited people to become “operatives” for an organization called Demand Protest. The story speculated that George Soros money was being used in this effort. If something does happen at the inauguration, I am betting the mainstream media will portray it as a “grass roots” event, when in fact, people were paid to do it. The reason I think this should be obvious: the main stream media isn’t reporting about Demand Protest or their solicitations with the exception of the Washington Times. I visited the website for Demand Protest. On the opening page it says this: “From grassroots organizations to advocacy groups, we seed the narratives and gather the audience you desire. When your strategy demands paid protest, we organize and bring it to life.”

From what I can see, the mainstream media is a full participant in these culture wars, which is why I don’t get my news anymore from them. They used to just report the news. Now they try to feed us a narrative. To tell you the truth, I am sick of the culture wars.

It is clear that our nation needs prayer more than ever. I highly encourage everyone to pray the prayer that Deacon Roger led at Mass last Sunday and others like it.
